



Warhol-style image:


1. Filter / Artistic / **Cutout** about (8,5,2) depending how far away you took the picture
2. Window menu / Color swatches (use default colors)
 → → **Use paint bucket tool with tolerance set to 5 or less (depending on the effect you want)**
 -Start filling in different areas with different colors.
3. You must also apply an additional effect by going to Filter / Artistic / **Poster Edges** (e.g.10,10,0)




READ THIS!!!!!!! → how to set up your Warhol-style artwork in Photoshop

File menu, New/ blank file, 9” X 9” 300 ppi (pixels/ inch) resolution --remember to use “inches” not pixels when choosing the dimensions (Width & Height).


→and don't forget to go to “VIEW” menu and choose “GRID” to show the “snap to” grid that'll help you!



→ use the “crop” tool (#1), and set it to **3” x 3” at 300ppi** (#2), and do the cropping (#3) before you cut and paste it to your gridded file.



Paste it to your grid. Repeat (Ctrl-J) until you have 9 images on the grid:




Ctrl-U each layer and change the colour.




→ View menu / un-check “grid” view to remove grid lines

Create a new layer on the bottom, use the crop tool to expand the frame (**YOU MUST RESET THE CROP TOOL** OR ELSE IT WILL REDUCE THE IMAGE TO 3” x 3”!!!!), and use the eyedropper to choose any foreground and background colour from the image and use the gradient tool to fill the background:



And Ctrl-E to flatten layers from top down, but not the bottom gradient layer. Now apply a bevel effect to the nine harmathys!!!

- Make one version of yourself as an “Andy Warhol” style 9X9 grid.
